The Consumer Studies group at the University of Ulster (www.ulster.ac.uk) is delighted to host the 'Third International Consumer Sciences Research Conference' on behalf of the Institute of Consumer Sciences (www.icsc.org.uk) and in partnership with the Consumer Council (www.consumercouncil.org.uk). The Consumer Council is pleased to be our partners for this conference, and their Chief Executive, Professor Gill, will be a keynote speaker. Consumer and Retail consultant Christine Cross (www.christinecross.com) and Professor Tim Lang (Professor of Food Policy, City University London) will also be keynote speakers. Other keynote speakers will be in the areas of consumer choice, consumer detriment, financial capability and management (Steve Stillwell, Financial Services Agency, www.fsa.gov.uk), food access availability, and policy, vulnerable consumers, home economics (Jenny Ridgwell, well known food and home economics publisher, www.ridgwellpress.co.uk) and consumer education. There will be sessions on consumer choice, consumer education, financial management, food and nutrition, textiles and all areas of Home Economics, dependant upon abstracts received. We therefore welcome abstracts from all areas of consumer science and home economics.

Belfast, the capital city, is served by excellent air links to most British airports and is also served by some international links (Amsterdam, Barcelona, Berlin, New York, Paris, Prague, Rome and Toronto). There are also excellent road and rail links with Dublin. The Jordanstown campus of the University is close to Belfast (7 miles), located on the shores of Belfast Lough *and has some accommodation on site at £26/25 per night bed and continental breakfast (not ensuite)*. There are also hotels and bed and breakfast accommodation available nearby in the town of Carrickfergus.

Abstracts

Abstracts in English only please, should not exceed one A4 page (approx. 400 words) and be 1.5 line-spaced with a clear indication of the title and author at the top of the page. Margins must be 2.5cm or 1 inch wide. The font type should be Times New Roman only, size 12. Please indicate whether submitted abstract is to be considered for **oral or poster** presentation, one of the authors must be a registered delegate.

Delegates accepted for oral/poster presentation and ICSc members will be entitled to a reduced conference fee of £120 one presenter only, see web site for full details of conference costs and accommodation.
